Open for pumpout locations in Maine

Proper Disposal of Boat Sewage
How to pump a boat's holding tank: Remove cap from boat's deck waste fitting. Insert pumpout hose nozzle into deck fitting. (An adaptor may be required for a proper fit. Marinas generally have them available. They are also for sale in a marine retail store.) Turn pump on. If there is a hose valve, open it to start suction. When waste is no longer a solid stream and bubbling action begins, close hose valve and remove nozzle from deck fitting. Put nozzle (with open valve) in bucket of water for 15 seconds to rinse hose. If desired, rinse boat's tank with water and pump dry. Close valve. Put away hose. Turn off pump if requested. (Some are on timers.) Replace deck fitting cap.

Millions of people enjoy Maine's coastal beaches each year. Yet water quality at these beaches is threatened by a variety of sources—including boats. Boat sewage, water from sinks and showers, cleaning products, spilled fuel, trash, and the introduction of exotic plants and animals not only degrade Maine's environment, but also prevent the enjoyment of Maine's recreational areas. Each one of us must share the responsibility for pollution prevention. Sometimes it is as simple as doing things a little differently. Your use of clean boating practices can result in a cleaner environment for everyone! We need every boater's help to keep Maine's beaches clean and healthy!



Why? Sewage contamination is a health threat. Local beaches have reported increased levels of *Enterococci* bacteria, which is an indicator of pathogens (disease-causing organisms) which cause diseases such as hepatitis, typhoid, cholera, dysentery, and gastroenteritis. Pumping sewage directly into the water also creates problems for fish and other aquatic life by lowering the oxygen level in the water. Plus, it's illegal. The increasing number of boaters in Maine's waters contributes to water quality problems. We can all do our part to eliminate pollution from local waters by using vessel pump-out facilities and adhere to the No Discharge Zone designation.

What you can do! Boaters can play a large role in the solution to sewage pollution. Install and properly use an MSD (preferably a holding tank) to keep raw sewage and chemicals out of the water. Avoid using holding tank additives that contain formaldehyde, chlorine, or "preservatives," as these chemicals can seriously harm marine life. Learn how an MSD works, make sure it functions properly and that the waste is going into the holding tank and not into the water, and make repairs when they are not adequate, boaters should encourage the dock operator to provide appropriate facilities. If your boat does not have an installed toilet, pack out all waste. Bring portable toilets ashore for proper waste disposal. Use pumpout facilities when available and ask for them if they are not. If you have questions about how to use the pumpout facilities, ask first (see info in sidebar: *Proper Disposal of Boat Sewage*).

Look for the Pumpout Sign

- Encourage the development of more pumpout stations, as well as portable toilet dump stations, and learn how to use them.
- Use swim diapers on young children and dispose of used diapers in trash.
- Pick up after your pet and dispose of waste in trash or pet waste receptacle.

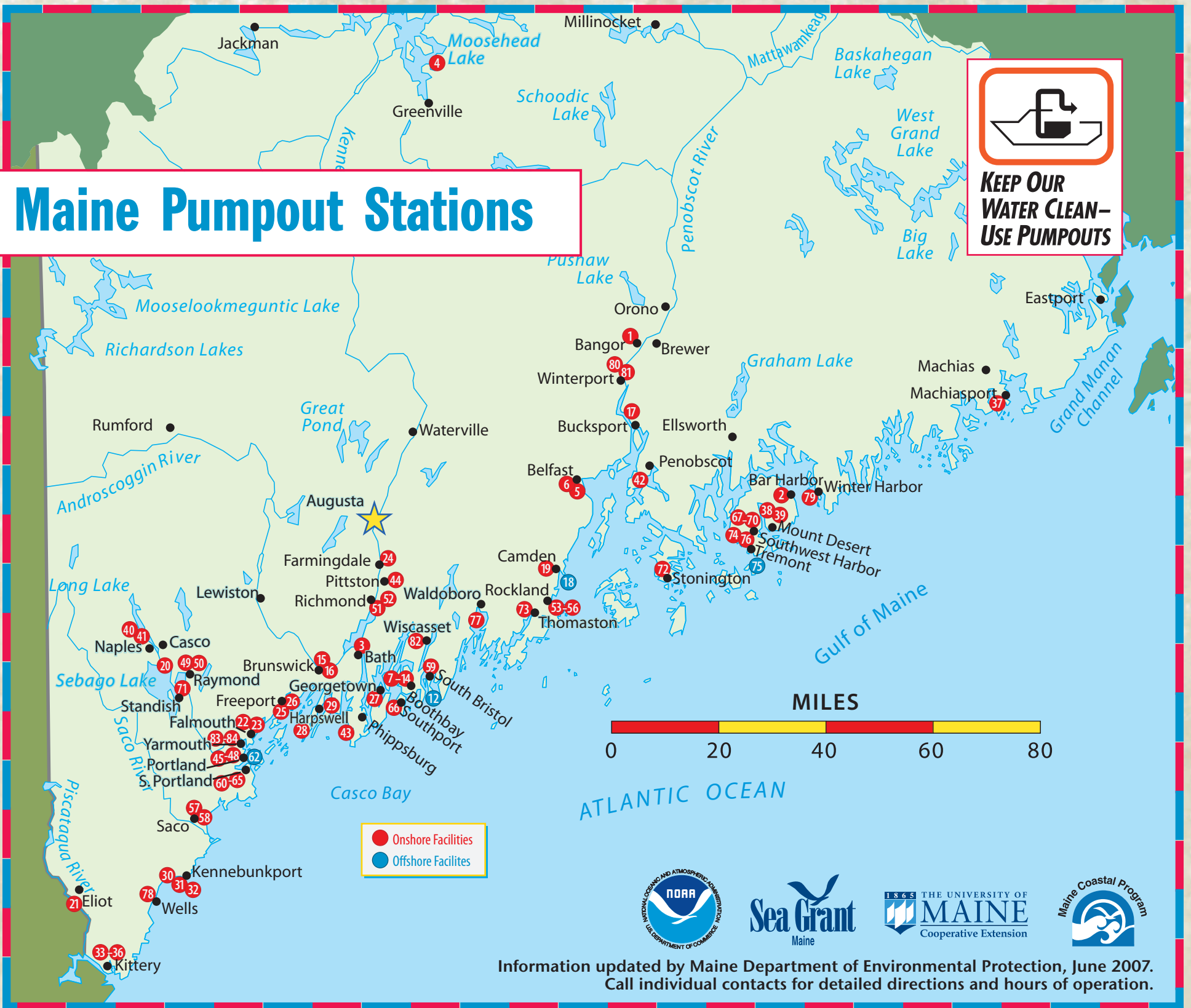
Did you know that?
 Maine now has a large area designated as a No Discharge Zone—Casco Bay. There are pumpout boats located in Casco Bay, Boothbay Harbor, Camden and Bass Harbor. For information on pumpout boats contact: The Friends of Casco Bay (207)799-8574; to schedule a pumpout, call (207)776-0136 The Town of Boothbay Harbor (207)633-4220 (for information and pumpout service) The Town of Camden Harbormaster (207)236-7969 (for information and pumpout service) Red Fern Pumpout Boat @ Up Harbor Marine 266-0270 (for information and pumpout service) Most of the pumpout boats monitor VHF Channel 9 or 16.

What's the Problem? Fecal contamination from the improper disposal of human waste during boating can make water unsightly and unable for recreation, destroy shellfishing areas, and cause severe human health problems. This sewage can close the very beach your family likes to visit. Boaters should never discharge untreated sewage directly into the water, unless they are 3 miles or farther offshore. While on the boat, fecal matter and other solid waste should be contained in a U.S. Coast Guard-approved marine sanitation device (MSD). Upon return to shore, portable toilets should be emptied into approved shoreline waste handling facilities, and holding tanks should be discharged into approved pumpout stations. It is illegal to discharge raw sewage within 3 miles of the coast! All boats with an installed toilet must have a properly functioning MSD. It is illegal to discharge any sewage (treated or untreated) in a No Discharge Zone designation. If you know of any violations, report them immediately to the proper authority (local harbormaster or Maine DEP—see contact info).
